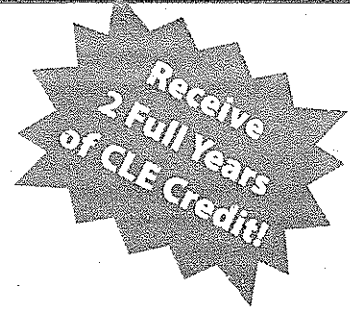


GARY CHRISTY MEMORIAL GEORGIA TRIAL SKILLS CLINIC



Thursday - Sunday, June 21 - 24, 2007

COURSE DESCRIPTION

The ICLE Georgia Trial Skills Clinic provides you, as the attendee, opportunities to perform in a realistic trial setting and receive advice necessary to develop and enhance your skills as a member of the trial bar from seasoned litigators and judges. For four days you will be on your feet, arguing, questioning witnesses and generally developing your trial skills. You will work on a civil case and a criminal case. The course emphasizes trial techniques, rather than substantive law. You will be assigned problems and must be prepared to perform in the role of the trial counsel. Your performance will be videotaped. You will learn from the critiques offered by the mentors and fellow attendees, from demonstrations by faculty members and by reviewing the videotape of your own work.

COURSE ADMINISTRATION

Steve Harper, the Director of Programs for ICLE, will administer this four-day program. Steve has been an Adjunct Professor teaching Trial Practice at the University of Georgia School of Law for the past eight years. Many of Georgia's finest attorneys and judges will be part of the great Clinic faculty. Some of the most experienced faculty will prepare papers and present talks on each phase of trial preparation, to include such topics as: Themes and Theories, Voir Dire, Openings, Evidentiary Foundations and Demonstrative Evidence, Direct and Cross Examination, Impeachment, and Closings. The goal of each member of the faculty is to enrich the overall professional experience for every attendee.

CANCELLATION POLICY

Cancellations reaching ICLE by 5:00 p.m. the day before the seminar date will receive a registration fee refund less a \$15.00 administrative fee. Otherwise, the registrant will be considered a "no show" and will not receive a registration fee refund. Program materials will be shipped after the program to every "no show." Designated substitutes may take the place of registrants unable to attend.

SEMINAR REGISTRATION POLICY

Early registrations must be received 48 hours before the seminar. ICLE will accept on-site registrations as space allows. However, potential attendees should call ICLE the day before the seminar to verify that space is available. All attendees must check in upon arrival and are requested to wear nametags at all times during the seminar. ICLE makes every effort to have enough program materials at the seminar for all attendees. When demand is high, program materials must be shipped to some attendees.

ATTENDANCE — Limited to 50

The Georgia Trial Skills Clinic will be limited to fifty students on a "first-come" basis. If demand exceeds the space available for this program, a stand-by list will be maintained. No refunds will be made for cancellations later than June 8th, unless the Institute is able to substitute an alternate attendee from the stand-by list.

TEACHING METHOD AND STUDENT COMMITMENT

Team teaching is the principal method of instruction. The faculty for each section will consist of experienced trial attorneys and/or judges. Participants have the opportunity and the obligation to offer comments and criticism that will be useful to the professional development of their fellow attendees. In return, each attendee will receive the benefit of evaluations of his/her own performance by faculty members and fellow participants.

We cannot emphasize enough the need for full commitment of your time for four days. Classes begin Thursday afternoon and meet all day Friday and Saturday, as well as Sunday morning. Evening preparation is required. It is the equivalent of preparing two cases for trial in four days. You will be expected to be prepared as an attorney for either side (with advance notice of specific assignments) of both cases in the materials. You will be provided, in advance, a full set of problems and case materials.
